
He saw the world through Mary's eyes excerpted from Star-Tribune tribute

Pete McKenna was born in Washington, DC to Peter and Mabel McKenna on August 24, 1924. He graduated from St. John's College High School in 1942, and he enlisted in the Army.

He was assigned to General George S. Patton's 3rd Army, 80th Infantry division as an anti-tank gunner. He sailed to Europe on the Queen Mary, landed in Normandy, and fought his way through France, Luxembourg and Belgium to Germany.

On April 2, 1945 in Kassel, Germany, a tank shell exploded in his face and he lost his eyes and two fingers. Pete spent two years in the hospital before being discharged. He enrolled at Catholic University of America in 1947 and with help from the Veteran's Administration, who provided readers, he graduated with honors in 1952. In 1948 while at the VA Hospital for more plastic surgery, he charmed his nurse Mary John, and they were married in June of 1949.

In 1951 Pete was elected National President of the Blinded Veterans Association. In the next eleven years he earned his Master



Pete was the main sales person at the Catholic gift shop until 1966 when he became the operator of a convenience shop at the Minneapolis City Hall and— with the help of his children—served the needs of Minneapolis city employees for many years. In 1977 he was able to utilize his counseling training to

become a full-time benefits counselor at the VA until his retirement in 1989. Pete enjoyed travel by car, plane and ship. As a member of the Friendship Force he travelled the world visiting Europe, Asia and South

America. He went with his family to Blinded Veterans conventions throughout the United States.

Pete loved Boy Scout camp—even in sub-zero Minnesota winters-and counseled many scouts working on their citizenship merit badges.

A year ago, Pete and his wife Mary were interviewed by Berni Marleau for a story in this newspaper. She asked: "Was it difficult, traveling without being able to see?"

Pete answered. "No, because Mary is an excellent describer. She describes everything, and I am able to see it in my mind's eye. I haven't missed anything with Mary by my side."

Peter died on April 3. He was 88.

State College and the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis.

Jeanne married Archie Goemer in 1949. They raised their three children Robert, Steven and Lynette in St. Louis Park.

For the majority of her professional career, Jeanne taught in the Robbinsdale Area Schools, from which she retired in 1988.

Following retirement, she was active in the Litchfield United Methodist Church and in the Das-

sel Saddle Club. Jeanne also volunteered at the Darwin Hill horse trails and park.

An afficionado of music, Jeanne also loved horseback riding, growing vegetables and flowers, traveling and spending time with family, grandchildren and friends.

MN/TC member Marcia Hinitz recalls Jeanne as a wonderful fellow ambassador on Friendship Force exchanges.

Jeanne died on March 20 at the age of 90.

Berni reports on Berni

Hi,

As you know from the last update, I had finished my chemo and radiation treatments. I kept getting weaker and more breathless. Even trying to stand up was a chore and really wiped me out. I was sleeping a lot.

It finally sunk in that these symptoms were probably not side effects from the treatments and were something else. I went to the doctor on March 26 and found out that I had multiple clots in both lungs. I could not be satisfied with only one clot, I had to have multiple clots.

I was hospitalized immediately and put on Lovenox twice a day. I could not be put on Coumadin because that would thin the blood out too much. The tumor in the brain could start bleeding and that would be the end of me.

So now I give myself shots twice a day. Things could be worse. Lovenox will not dissolve the clots but make them inactive, and hopefully no more clots will appear.

They wanted to send me home on March 29, but I did not feel safe or comfortable with that plan. I was still too



weak and tired easily. I asked to be transferred to a transitional care facility until I gained some strength and felt comfortable going home. I was sent to Langton Place in Roseville, which was exactly what I needed. I went home on Saturday, April 6.

So far things are going really well. I am able to implement a lot of the things I learned at Langton Place into my daily routine.

On Wednesday of this week, I go for my MRI and on Friday, I learn if the treatments worked

and what is the next part of the treatment for the brain tumor and the blood clots. I will let you know at that time what the prognosis is. The thing that is hard to get used to is that I tire so easily. I can't do the things that I usually do or take for granted. Hopefully, that will come back. I was told that I would get about 70 percent of my strength back. That is so frustrating, but things could be worse.

Now, it is time for a nap. Take care, *Berni*
