They do this through exploring, understanding, serving, and stepping up in leadership roles. The Board reviewed the qualifications of the 2020 nominees, finding all equally outstanding. In a year when things are not typical, the Board decided to give the award to three worthy members, presented on the next page in alphabetical order

Don Wolter was our newsletter editor for 18 years. Since his death in 2013, we have honored Don and his many contributions to our club by giving the Don Wolter Service Award to a deserving member each year. ### Mary Cunningham

Mary joined Friendship Force in 1980 and has served in several roles within the club including club treasurer, exchange director for three outbound journeys, host for several exchanges, and as ambassador for several journeys.

Mary's first outbound journey as exchange director was in 1994 to Taiwan, the second was to Singapore, Malaysia, and Thailand, which was followed by New Zealand in 2003. The New Zealand exchange was so successful that the New Zealand club requested an inbound journey to Minnesota in 2005, with Mary serving as inbound director.

Mary served as the club treasurer in 2009 and 2010. She and her late husband, Bill Cunningham, were

ambassadors to Russia in 1996 and to Japan in 2013. When the club started to partner with the Open World program in 2013, Mary and Bill went the extra mile to make this successful. Mary has served on the planning committee for all four Open World programs, served as a host for two of the programs, and she and Bill opened their home for welcome dinners for the Open World delegates.

### Jane Norman

Jane joined Friendship Force in 1981 as an ambassador to Venezuela, traveling with 250 people, as was common in early exchanges. She has continued to travel globally and home host, day host, and dinner host ambassadors from around the world.

Jane led exchanges in 1991 to Thailand and China, and the inbound exchange from Omaha in 1993. Club members loved the road trips she led to the North Shore in 2014, and the Iron Range in 2018, proudly promoting areas around her native home of Duluth. She offered a MN Up North mini-tour for the 2020 Super Regional Conference, which sadly was cancelled due to covid-19.

Jane served as club president (1992-93), vice president (2003-2004), co-leader with Joyce Sharp for the 1990





## Joyce Sharp

Joyce has been on 23 Exchanges with Friendship Force since she joined in 1987, with her first trip to New Albans, England; she's stayed in touch with her home host all these years. Joyce has traveled to Europe, Asia, Japan, South and Central America and Cuba (in 2001). She's also traveled on domestic exchanges, remembering fondly Rio Grande Texas, among many. She also recalls joyfully holding a very soft koala on her trip to Australia.

Joyce frequently stepped into leadership roles, including five times as exchange director, two with incoming groups from Australia, and one outbound to South Australia. In 2011 she led a three-state exchange with a Mississippi River theme, taking

Travel was at a near standstill for much of 2020 and the big question we're all asking is what will travel look like in 2021? According to AARP, you can expect the following:

- Those \$200 airline change fees may be gone for good. Looking to get more passengers on planes, many airlines in 2020 stopped charging their exorbitant fees to cancel or change domestic flights.
- 2. Flexibility will be everything. Before committing to a trip, travelers will want assurance that they can easily cancel their cruise, hotel or tour without penalty.
