

Although they have not traveled outside the North American continent, their favorite trip was to Calgary, Canada. Where once again the spirit of Friendship and getting to know a new place and people made for a fun an enjoyable trip.



Unfortunately, Marianne is no longer with us, but Les continues to be an active club member who lights up any group with his youthful appearance, radiant smile, gift of storytelling, and ready jokes. 

A garage made of logs was to be a learning experience in his transition into retirement. There was no blueprint or plan as such. The closest thing to a plan was the dimensions for the slab foundation. From there, the structure just grew to its final shape. The first log went in place in May of 1986 and the structure was complete in the Fall of 1990. Les's log garage was complete with an upper sleeping room and a chandelier.

But Les and Marianne didn't stop at a garage; a sauna and an outdoor toilet (complete with stained glass window and chandelier) were to follow – after they did a complete refurbishing of their cabin. I had the opportunity to occupy the upper room in the garage and to use his fancy toilet when four of us Friendship Force members were invited up to his cabin this past summer. We all were impressed with his craftsmanship and Marianne's sewing and needlework skills. This place is a labor of love and a testimony to two very skilled, dedicated people, and what can be accomplished after completing a lifelong job. *Their legacy will live on – and what a gift for their children!*

Travel Bytes

Americans are once again on the move as Covid-19 restrictions are eased. The Center for Disease Control (CDC) is no longer warning those who are fully vaccinated against cruise travel. It is however still recommending those who are unvaccinated to avoid travel on cruise ships.


The CDC has lowered warning levels for dozens of popular destination countries but still recommends vaccinations before travel. Europe has opened up to Americans this summer season under certain conditions and with roadblocks to easy passage, usually regarding proof of vaccination or negative Covid-19 test results. Rules vary in each EU country so do your homework beforehand.

In order to board a flight to the US, both visitors and returning American citizen s must provide documentation of a negative viral test taken within three days of departure or show documentation they have recovered from Covid-19.

You now have until May 2023 before you will need a securityenhanced REAL ID instead of a regular driver's license in order to get through airport security. This deadline was recently moved up from October 2021.
