President: Tom Scott (Incumbent)





Douglas W. Barr

August 13,1923 – September 4, 2021 Minneapolis MN

Doug Barr was loved and respected by many and will be truly missed by all who knew him. Doug was born to Arthur and Eva Barr August 13, 1923, grew up on a family farm in Wood Lake MN, excelled in studies and sports in his small-town high school and then went on to Harvard. After only one year there, WWII broke out and he enlisted in the Army Air Corps. He then studied Meteorology and was posted to the Pacific theater where he forecasted

weather for crews flying missions there. Back in Minnesota, he earned a Bachelors in Civil Engineering, and a Masters in Hydrology at the U of MN.

In 1953, Doug started an engineering consulting firm that grew into Barr Engineering Co. as an employee-owned corporation. From its initial focus on hydrology and water management, Barr Engineering has become acclaimed experts in many fields. The company culture at Barr Engineering was based on Doug's free-form thinking that every employee could work as if they were a consultant and manage their own time. His innovative approach and warm, welcoming nature helped make Barr Engineering an engaging and rewarding place to work. The company has grown to 10 offices in the U.S. and Canada, with over 900 employees.

Doug valued physical health and ran two miles every day, even in MN winters, until into his 90's, played pick-up basketball with men less than half his age into his 80's, and loved canoe trips in the Boundary Waters and sailing on Lake Harriet. He and Janet enjoyed traveling throughout the world his last 18 years. All who knew him can be certain that even now he is making the angels smile with his impromptu puns. We'll miss you, Doug.

Travel Bytes by Buck MacDonald, Board Director

After more than a year of banning foreign leisure travelers from entering the US, the government announced that residents from other countries may visit with proof of vaccination, beginning in early November. They will also need to show proof of a negative Covid-19 test.

The European Union (EU) has taken the US off its safe-travel list, causing some countries like Spain, France and Denmark to bar unvaccinated leisure travelers from the US. EU countries' rules vary so travelers should do their research and check the CDC's country-specific recommendations.

The CDC continues to revise its travel recommendations for countries around the world recommending that people should currently not visit high-risk countries such as Great Britain, France and Iceland. For lower risk countries such as Italy, Mexico, Poland, Hungary, etc., the CDC still recommends being fully vaccinated before visiting. For people with an increased risk of severe illness, the CDC advises avoiding cruise ship and river-cruise travel.

Canada has opened its borders to US travelers who show proof of full vaccination and a pre-entry Covid-19 test. Meanwhile, the US continues to restrict travel to the US from its two closest neighbors Canada and Mexico
