In March of 2016, we will be heading to the South Pacific region of the world. Two clubs have graciously agreed to host us: Horowhenua, which is in the north island of New Zealand and North Moreton which is located in the Sunshine Coast of Australia.

North Moreton is just north of Brisbane, the capital of Queensland. Beautiful beaches, scenic mountains, lakes, rainforest walks, boutique wineries and kangaroos on the door step; they have it all! Marvel at the calls of the whip birds as we walk through the rainforest. Get close to a koala at the fabulous Australia Zoo, the creation of legendary Crocodile Man, Steve Irwin. Walk along some of the most beautiful beaches in the world. This area is also rich in culture and history. Redcliffe was the first settlement in Queensland and was once a penal colony.

Horowhenua is the name of this region and is steeped in Maori history. Levin is the center of the Horowhenua region and is nestled between the Tararua Ranges and the beautiful Tasman Sea ocean beaches. Orchards, fresh vegetable stalls and garden nurseries can be found on the outskirts. Enjoy the reserves and beaches and outdoor activities such as swimming and bush walking. Golf,

hobby shopping or a Maori cultural experience will enhance our visit. Visiting with extended families are likely to be included in our visit also.

An optional pre or post tour to another region may be added if there is sufficient interest. The group will make this decision.
