Annual dues for 2018 will be \$35 per member, as voted on by our Club's Board of Directors at the September meeting. The deadline for 2018 dues is January 1, 2018.

Rather than offering a discount to households, all members will pay an equal amount. This change comes from the leadership at Friendship Force International in the spirit of trying to equalize dues.



What are your dues used to pay? \$15 goes directly to FFI to support national programming and education, maintain the FFI website, and support the work of 15 staff who manage the Journeys each year. The remaining \$20 stays with our local chapter. A portion goes to administrative costs to cover the fee to host our website, periodic mailings, and maintain our status as a Friendship Force International club. Another portion goes to education and outreach. This year, our local Club sponsored two members to attend the Annual Conference in Manchester, England. This paid for part of

their registration fee and some other expenses, allowing them to spread the story of FF/MN/TC as well as learn from other Clubs around the world. Additionally, a portion goes to celebrating our friendship with one another through supporting social events such as our quarterly meetings, summer picnic and a holiday party. We look forward to welcoming you as a member again in 2018. Some of us are actively involved: taking Journeys, hosting guests, and working together on the board and on committees. Others have served for many years in the past and now choose to enjoy the company of others at social events, remembering previous ventures with FF friends over the years.
