FIRST MEMORIES OF GERMANY – FRIENDSHIP FORCE 1978

That first Friendship Force trip in 1978 was my longest journey to date.

Our group took off from Minneapolis, and after a quick refueling stop on the east coast, flew throughout the short night all the way to Berlin. By the time we arrived on that chilly morning in Germany, the adrenalin that had kept me awake for about the whole week before had worn off, and I was absolutely bone tired.

I probably could have slept standing up, but my host Gisela Steinbiss kindly showed me into the bedroom she had commandeered from her seven year old son Holger for my use during the trip.

Holger was at school already so I was able to climb undisturbed into that wonderful cozy bed with those crisp clean cotton sheets and that warm comforter and...

I believe I was sound asleep within the first two minutes of lying down.

Ten minutes later -- or maybe it was ten hours -- I couldn't really tell which, I opened my eyes to find a cute little kid looking down on me and smiling.



"Hello" I said.

He kept staring.

"My name is Peter, what's yours?"

He kept staring.

I spoke a little louder: "Are you Holger? How old are you? Are you just getting back from school now?"

But he just continued to look down at me, and wordlessly kept smiling.

Oh my goodness, I realized, the poor kid is deaf. Oh, that's sad...

Finally, fully half a minute into this tableau the dim lightbulb went off in my jet-lag-muddled mind:

"Peter, you are not in Minnesota anymore – you are in Germany.

Of course, this kid speaks *GERMAN*, you dummkoph!

So using my tiny bit of "pigeon German" I was able to say "Guten Auben, my nam-ma ist Peter!" and sure enough my new "deaf" friend Holger immediately started chatting away a mile a minute, and didn't stop until we hugged goodbye two weeks later.

Admittedly, neither of us always understood each other's spoken words, but that didn't stop us seeing who could run up the steps to the top of the Berlin radio tower faster, or from making faces at one another behind her back when Gisela served a smelly fish dish, or from laughing at Bug's Bunny cartoons with the sound turned off.

You might say we invented our own language during that trip: We spoke "Friendship".
