# **Journey to Jordan**

Matthew Nidek, of Friendship Force International, served as the Journey Coordinator for a trip to explore Jordan's remarkable historical sites and also to connect personally with the people of Jordan. Friendship Force coordinated our twelve-day global journey by contracting with an organization entitled Engaging Cultures Travel of Jordan.

The journey included home hospitality for three nights in the village of Orjan where we helped our family pick olives for two days. It was an intimate experience to join families around an olive tree and share in

this time-honored tradition. Lunch and tea were served under the olive trees. Later we visited a local olive press to learn where the olive oil was processed.

We explored the Wadi Rum desert area, following the footsteps of Lawrence of Arabia. We stayed at a Bedouin Tribal camp for three nights in goat hair tents and dined in their local homes. Our journey included a swim in the Dead Sea where we stayed for two nights in a five-star hotel. We visited many women's cooperatives during the journey where we learned how to cook the national dish, mensaf, how to make traditional crafts, and how the Arab bread is made over a fire.

We explored Petra, one of the seven Wonders of the world by walking through the Siq, a mile-long canyon that ends at the Treasury, Petra's most famous carved façade. We rode camels into Petra on our second day entering from a secret passage.

We visited the historical site of the Baptism of Jesus on the Jordan River and drove up to Mt. Nebo, the location where Moses looked out across the Holy Land. The journey also included a guided tour of Jerash, one of the largest cities of ancient Rome in the Middle East.

If this journey becomes available again, we highly recommend you engage in this Middle East cultural exchange.
