
View historic and contemporary photographs, maps, and artifacts — and learn how Native people have retained cultural practices, teachings and values, and an essential connection to home."

Making Your Flight and Trip More Hassle Free by Cindy Cauble

TSA Precheck. Many of you have already heard of TSA Precheck. Precheck costs \$85 for five years and is now available at more than <u>200 U.S. airports including MSP</u>. Although TSA reports that 93 percent of PreCheck passengers wait less than five minutes, you are not guaranteed access to the PreCheck line. You can enroll online at <u>tsa.gov</u> to pre-enroll and pay the \$85 fee. A personal interview is required at an enrollment center or airport where you will be fingerprinted and show proper identification documents. After your interview, allow several weeks to receive an email with your Trusted Traveler Number or Known Traveler Number (KTN). Enter this number into your flight information so your boarding pass is printed with PreCheck status. A card will arrive in the mail later.

Global Entry. My friends who are world travelers told me that Global Entry is really the way to go and is also a 5-year program. Not only does it include TSA PreCheck but also allows approved American travelers faster clearance through customs when they re-enter the US by air or land. Global Entry status is honored at all US airports and 13 approved airports abroad. It is administered by the Department of Homeland Security Customs and Border Protection (CPB). You can apply online at the CPB website. After creating an account, you complete a Trusted Traveler application and pay a \$100 fee. My daughter just applied for this program since she didn't have TSA PreCheck but it did take over a month to complete. Once your application is approved, you will be notified to set an appointment for your personal interview. Expect the interview to last about 30 minutes. At the end, you will be told whether you qualify and be given a Trusted Traveler Number. Later, you will receive a card with your number. Because it includes PreCheck, Global Entry is an obvious option for anyone who takes even just a few international trips within the five years of membership.

App for packing. PackPoint is a free travel packing list organizer and packing planner for serious travelers. PackPoint will help you organize what you need to pack in your luggage. Categories are prebuilt but you can create your own as well. It's easy to add or subtract items and modify your list. Once your list is complete, you can name it and save in the app. PackPoint can be linked with TripIt if you are a TripIt user. Getting current weather conditions at each destination is a nice feature. Some versions of PackPoint will give you suggestions of what to pack based on location, length of stay and type of trip. I used it recently on a 21-day trip. I liked that I could use the list "in reverse" to make sure I got everything back in my suitcase and backpack!
